St. Joe's Back Pack Assistance program supplies food to 134 students in four school districts in the Fox Valley area (13 elementary schools). Students are identified by school counselors or principals who recognize that these children may not have a good nutritional support system at home. The premise of the program is to be sure that children in need have food to sustain them through the weekend. The program runs throughout the school year.
